MAYVILLE—Ten of fifteen county villages will be having elections on Tuesday March 16, according to Chautauqua County Election Commissioners Norman P. Green and Brian C. Abram.

The Celoron Village election will be conducted by the county Board of Elections with hours from Noon to 9 P.M. at the Celoron Fire Hall. Voters will be casting ballots using the county's new op-scan paper ballot voting technology.

Incumbent Celoron Republican Trustees Richard Kogut and Robin Young have been cross endorsed for re-election at recent Democratic and Republican party caucuses and are seeking new two year terms. Independent petitions from minor parties can still be filed at the Board of Elections for Celoron from February 2-9, 2010 and for all other villages at the respective village clerk offices.

Bertrando and William C. Thompson.
