## A message from the Director. . . . .



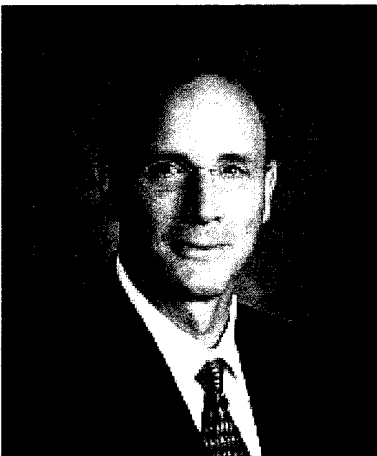

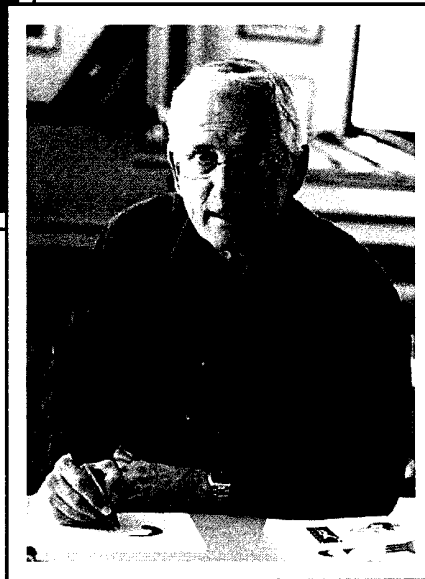

# OFA FUNDED PROGRAMS

Services listed below are available through any OFA outreach office. Call the main numbers indicated on the previous page unless otherwise indicated.

## **Caregiver Support Program ..... 753-4781, 661-7781, or 363-4781**

In home visits, counseling, and resource for caregivers as well as:

- **Monthly Support Groups:** north and south county locations.
- **Monthly Newsletter:** articles and information especially for caregivers.
- **Friendly Visitors:** Volunteers who call or make home visits.
- **Respite Care:** In facility or day programs, call for more information.

## **Developmental Disabilities Program..753-8843, 661-8843, or 363-3843**

Ongoing case management services, referrals and follow-up contacts for older adults who have physical, mental or emotional disabilities. Seniors who have adult children with disabilities may also contact this program.

## **Elder Abuse Prevention Program . 753-4479, 661-7479, or 363-4479**

Assistance for seniors at risk for or victims of abuse or neglect. Trained caseworker will assess situations and arrange appropriate assistance. Also provides training for professional and public education.

## **Health Insurance Information Counseling & Assistance**

Unbiased information and counseling about Medicare and other insurances. Assists seniors to make informed choices about their health care. Computer generated comparisons of prescription drug plans, other insurance plans, and assistance with enrollment. Call for an appointment.

## **Home & Community Care Services**

OFA funds services to keep older adults safe and independent as possible in the community, including housekeeping, personal care, adult day care, and personal emergency systems. Some cost sharing may be required depending on income. Call NY Connects (page 7) for more information or to arrange for services.

## **Home Heating and Adaptation Program**

- **Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)**

One time benefit helps low income seniors pay heating bills. Emergency HEAP benefit also available to assist with disconnection notice, lack of heating fuel, and furnace repair or replacement. Annual application required.

- **Home Adaption and Repair:** Referral and assistance for home weatherization and adaptations to improve access such as ramps and grab bars., May also provide assist to repair or replace roofs, furnaces, and septic systems.

**Legal Services for the Elderly ..... 363-3865 or 661-8940**

Consultation and limited representation on public benefit programs, landlord/tenant issues, and other areas of civil law. Call for an appointment.

**Long-term Care Ombudsman Program..**

**753-4781, 661-7781 or 363-4781**

Trained volunteers advocate for and visit people living in adult homes and nursing homes. They serve as a liaison between residents and staff.

**Nutrition Program**

- **Senior Dining Sites & Restaurant “Dining-Out”** (see below)
- **Nutrition Education & Counseling:** Provided monthly at senior dining sites. Registered Dietitian will also provide individual or group counseling
- **Meals on Wheel/Home Delivered Meals:** See page 5.

**SENIOR RESTAURANT “DINING OUT” PROGRAM**

Full meal from a senior menu offered at several local diners including Grandma’s Kitchen, Meeders, and Dutch Village. Diners must register and request tickets from Office for the Aging. Suggested donation is \$3/ticket. Diner must present ticket when ordering at the restaurant and gratuity is not included.

## MEALS ON WHEELS/ HOME DELIVERED MEALS



The home delivered meal program is done in collaboration with Jamestown Area Meals on Wheels, Dunkirk-Fredonia Meals on Wheels and the Sinclairville 76ers. An in-home assessment will be completed to determine eligibility and meals are delivered to seniors in their home who meet criteria. A hot or cold noon meal and cold supper are available based on needs of the client. Cost is based on ability to pay.

### **Senior Employment Program ..... 753-4856, 661-7856 or 363-4856**

- Training-to-work: funded by the Department of Labor for adults 55 and older, who meet income requirements. Enrollees are placed in government or not-for-profit agencies to learn employment skills.
- Computer Training: Free basic computer classes with a coach guide you through the Generations Online tutorial. Learn mouse use, key boarding, e-mail, and internet navigation. Call for times and locations.

### **Senior Safety**

OFA works with Triad (see page 14) and other community partners to keep seniors safe through a variety of programs:

- **911 Cell Phones**: Free & available in an emergency to call 911 only!
- **CarFit**: Safety check-up for you in your car. Do you know everything about adjusting your car mirrors, steering wheel and seat? Would you like tips on how to drive safely for as long as possible? Check out a CarFit session coming soon to a senior center near you.
- **PERS**: Personal Emergency Response System. Bracelet or necklace button to call for help when you can't get to the phone.
- **Operation RUSH**: Rush Us Safely Home. Bracelet or necklace worn by individuals who are prone to wander due to memory impairment.
- **RUOK**: Computer generated phone call that asks " Are you OK?" If you can not answer, your emergency contact is called or help is sent to you directly.
- **911 Rural House Numbering Project**: Special signs with glow in the dark numbers so emergency personnel can find your home day or night. Call the Office of the Sheriff at 753-4900 to order.

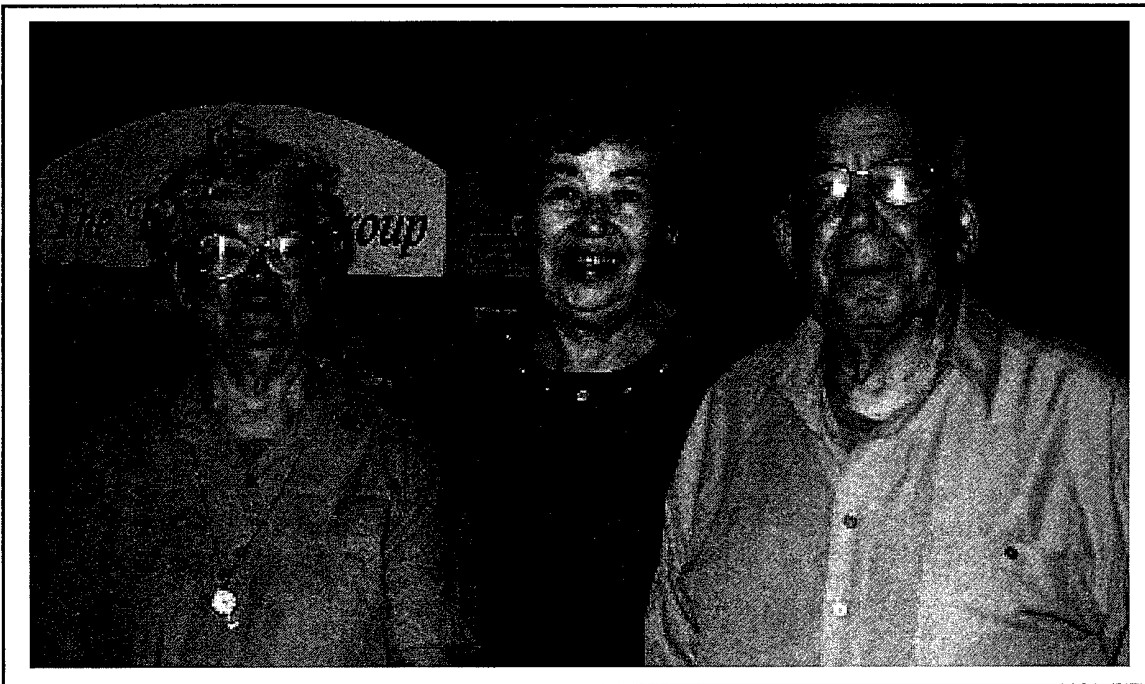
## Health Promotion & Wellness Programs

OFA nurses offer group or individual counseling and coordinate community activities including:

- **Exercise Classes:** At various locations throughout the county. Enjoy Tai Chi, Healthy Bones, Stepping On to prevent falls and others. Call NY Connects for details.
- **Flu Clinic:** Offered in the fall at many locations around the county.
- **Medication Management Plans:** Call for an appointment.
- **Health & Wellness Fairs:** OFA participates in several events to bring information and free health screenings to elders at various times throughout the year.

## OFA Medical Transportation:

Rides to medical appointments are available for ambulatory patients age 60 and over. Call to schedule at least 2 days in advance (See page 10).

## Lake Shore Long Term Home Health Care Program ..... 951-7160

An alternative to “nursing home” placement, this program offers all “nursing home” services to clients in their homes. Reimbursement may be available under Medicaid and limited Medicare. Clients may also pay privately for these services.

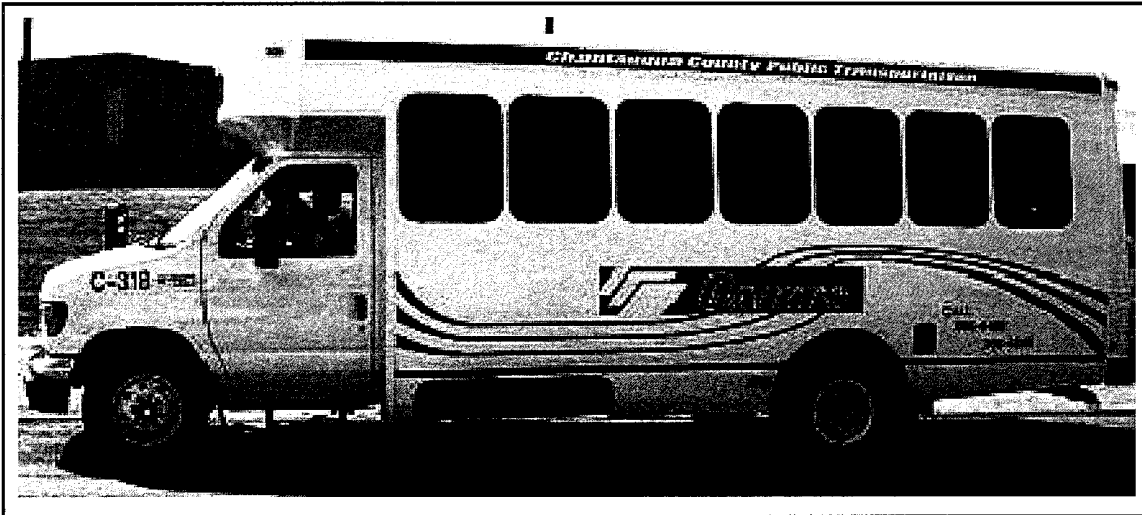

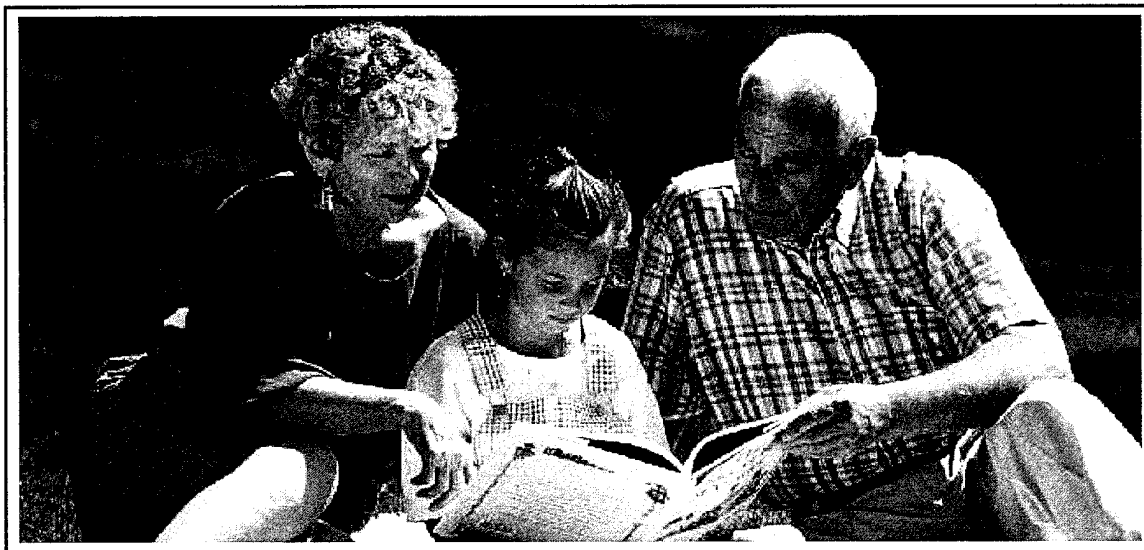

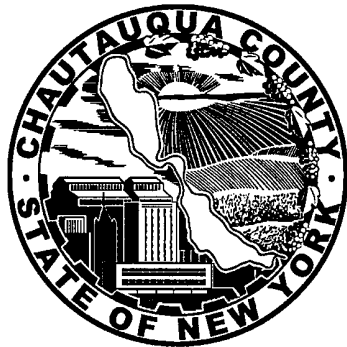
